





College Requirements




Entrance into College usually needs four senior (grade 11 or 12) level courses at C, M, or U including English (ENG4C1). Each program has their own specific criteria so check carefully.

University Requirements



In order to be considered for University, students will need to successfully complete **six Grade Twelve U or M level courses including English** (ENG4U1) during the completion of their Ontario Secondary School Diploma.



Course Delivery Options

	Who teaches?	How is the class taught?
Face to Face	Taught by Sinclair teachers	Physically at Sinclair for 75 minutes per class per day
Synchronous Virtual (Formally DDSB@Home)	Taught by Sinclair teachers	Online with the teacher for 75 minutes per class per day. These classes are fully separate from Face to Face classes.
Asynchronous eLearning (DDSB/OELC)	Taught by DDSB teachers and potentially a teacher from another school board that is part of the Ontario eLearning Consortium.	Students schedule their own time over the semester. Students are expected to work on their course for a minimum of 8 hours per week.





- myBlueprint does not have an external course guide. Descriptions are found while entering your courses into planner.
- You can filter by Grade and Discipline and search by key-words as well.



Study/Spare Codes

- You must have completed 24 credits to be eligible for a Study Period.
 STUDY1 – study in semester 1 STUDY2 – study in semester 2 STUDY – study will be scheduled in <u>either</u> semester 1 <u>or 2</u>.
- We recommend that eligible students only select 1 STUDY period. This is because many students change their mind and try to add a class later but find the availability is limited. By selecting 7 classes now students will not have that issue and can always ask for a second STUDY once they have received their timetable in August.
- If students select 2 STUDY periods then the <u>must</u> select STUDY1 and STUDY2.

SBI4U1 - Biology

💄 Grade 12 🍎 SBI4U1 📕 1 Credit

This course provides students with the opportunity for in-depth study of the concepts and processes that occur in biological systems. Students will study theory and conduct investigations in the areas of biochemistry, metabolic processes, molecular genetics, homeostasis, and population dynamics. Emphasis will be placed on the achievement of detailed knowledge and the refinement of skills needed for further study in various branches of the life sciences and related fields.

Guidance Message

Students are recommended to have completed both SBI3U1 and SCH3U1 as this course covers Biochemistry.

Accelerated/Upgrading eLearning Grades 10-12:


- First term in July and second term in August

1) If the class is a compulsory (English) then you must select it in your plan. Then add a second alternate to represent the class you want to substitute for the compulsory class.


2) During the review process, please add a Guidance note in your My Blueprint planner to inform us of your plans to take summer school. (Next Slide)


