- Students must have achieved a mark of 35% 49% to be eligible


Accelerated

- Four week course in July
- Grade 10, 11 and 12 courses
- Most courses are in Science, Math, English, and Careers and Civics.
- eLearning \$1 July
- eLearning S2 August

- ✓ This does NOT sign you up for summer school but it lets us know your intentions
- ✓ IF you are taking two remedial courses at Summer School include both in your course planner

 When you choose courses based on a concern about closing doors, you are suggesting that the door locks behind you. There are many pathways to the destination you dream of.




THINK ABOUT YOUR OWN CAREER JOURNEY
