You may not know what you want to do for a career and that is OK! It is still necessary to plan for the next steps after high school.



#### Earn while you learn!

- There are over 150 skilled trades in Ontario!
- Must first find a sponsor/employer to hire and train you
- Training agreement signed prepared by an Apprenticeship Branch consultant (MLTSD)
- 90% training is practical on-the-job
- **10%** is theoretical in-class

## Applying to College?

- www.ontariocolleges.ca
  - Program specific Pre-requisitesi.e. Paramedic (ENG4C1, MAP4C1, SBI3C1, SCH4C1)
  - Highly Competitive Program Chart: Marks required above the minimum!! Apply before Feb 1, 2024
- Application Fee \$125 for 5 choices
   (programs beginning in September 2024)
   (no more than 3 programs at any one college)
- You can still apply for non-competitive programs until August

## Special Information

- Equal Consideration Dates for Applying to Competitive Programs - Feb 1, 2024 Most common deadline to confirm offers for College-May 1, 2024 (check offer of admission posted to your account)
- Extra Requirements Your school will communicate with you directly via email or portal.
   Specific Tests-IELTS, volunteer hours, CPR/First Aid, portfolio, auditions etc..

## When do I get accepted?

- Colleges can send out offers as early as November, for non-oversubscribed programs.
- Competitive college programs make decisions based on marks up to finals from semester. Grade 11 marks are also considered. Offers are released throughout the year.

## Applying to University?

- www.ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca
- Application Fees
  - \$156 first 3 choices PLUS \$50/choice above initial 3 choices i.e. 5 total choices: 156+100 = \$256
  - some supplemental fees
- Relax!! You don't have to apply RIGHT NOW even if your friend at another school has applied. Ontario schools give equal consideration if you apply by the deadline Jan 15/24.

## Other Application Information

- Every College and University will create an account/portal for you on their student system where they communicate with you regarding additional information.
  - Personal Statements
  - Auditions
  - Specific Tests and Qualifications
  - etc...
- You must <u>check your school specific</u> <u>accounts regularly</u> so you do not miss any required deadlines.

## **Application Deadlines:**

- University Equal Consideration Date Jan 15, 2024
- College Equal Consideration Date for Highly Competitive Programs
   Feb 1, 2024
- Applicants are encouraged to apply before these dates since website volumes are highest at these times.



## When do I get accepted?

- This can be VERY, VERY stressful for students.
- Each College and University have "Admission Windows" of when offers are released.
- Colleges can start providing offers as of November, 2023.
   May 1, 2024- Most common deadline to confirm offers (check offer of admission on portal)
- University offers may be sent out by universities as a recruiting tool for programs as early as December.
- Many university programs are competitive so you may have to wait for semester 2 midterms and all required admission requirements to be reviewed. This is late-April. For competitive programs, you may have to wait until late May.



## Easy Street Now? Not Yet!!

## ALL Offers of Admissions are CONDITIONAL!!!

Read the conditions (eg. min 70% in ENG4U1) and make sure you meet them or the school will take back your offer if your program is competitive.

Most schools do not wait for Summer School upgrades.

## Ontario Learn and Stay Grant

Applying to Nursing, paramedic or medical lab technology programs?

Program must be in a priority community (Northern Ontario/Eastern or Southwest Ontario)

- -Receive free tuition, book \$ etc.
- -Must commit to working in the same community where you studied for a period of time defending on length of program (2 years of work for 4 year program)

#### **OSAP**

- Estimator Tool Online

- OSAP is based on the program you apply for and the total costs for the year.
- OSAP is now attached with your application and you can start the process when you apply to College or University.

### Other Important Dates:

May 29, 2024: Last day you can expect a response from an Ontario university if you applied by the January 15 deadline.

June 3, 2024: The earliest day you may be required to respond to an offer at an Ontario University and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration or residence deposit).


To provide culturally-responsive support for Black students and their families as they navigate the post-secondary application and admissions process.
